Direction under s 70 of the Health Act 1956

On 24 March 2020, the Prime Minister, with the agreement of the Minister of Health, issued an epidemic notice under s 5 of the Epidemic Preparedness Act 2006 in respect of COVID-19. The epidemic notice allows the use of special powers by Medical Officers of Health, pursuant to s 70 of the Health Act 1956, for the purpose of preventing the outbreak or spread of COVID-19. The epidemic notice has been renewed until 20 September 2021.

For the purpose of preventing further outbreak or spread of COVID-19, which I consider to be a significant risk to the public, I, Dr Niki Stefanogiannis, Medical Officer of Health for all health districts of New Zealand, make the following direction under sections 70(1)(ea) and (f) of the Health Act 1956:

This direction applies to any person who attended the locations of interest in Wellington, New Zealand at the times and dates (New Zealand Standard Time), as set out in Schedule 1.

I require these people to do the following:

- 1. Isolate or quarantine at their usual place of residence (which for visitors, includes accommodation);
- 2. Report themselves for medical testing by contacting Healthline (0800 358 5453) and advising that they are a close contact or casual contact of a case of COVID-19 in Wellington, New Zealand.
- 3. Submit themselves for medical testing for COVID-19 at a time and place appropriate to their current location and the time of their last potential exposure to COVID-19, as set out in guidance published on the Ministry of Health website (www.health.govt.nz);
- 4. Except as required to report and submit for testing as directed:
 - a. remain isolated or quarantined at their usual place of residence for a time as advised by, or on behalf of a Medical Officer of Health, but:
 - b. no longer than 14 days from the date of their last potential exposure to COVID-19, as set out in guidance published on the Ministry of Health website (www.health.govt.nz).

Failure or refusal to comply with this direction is an offence under s 72 of the Health Act 1956, punishable by up to 6 months' imprisonment and/or up to a \$4000 fine.
